Instructions for Completing Course Selection Form (CSF)

As you select courses, use the [Course Selection Worksheet](#) and the [Course Schedule](#) to make sure your courses do not overlap. Remember to include lecture times and discussion sections.

Research Academic Requirements

Choosing a balanced course load is a vital element in having a successful fall term. In addition to the information below, please follow the [Academic Checklist](#) to ensure you select appropriate courses. You may choose up to four courses total.

Indicate Your Reading & Composition (R&C) Course Preferences

Your R&C course is determined by your exam scores and/or transferable college courses. You may not know all of your exam scores until July. For now, assume you will place into an R&C course and indicate your preferred lecture days (Monday & Wednesday afternoons or Tuesday & Thursday afternoons) and course preferences. When FPF receives your exam scores and/or college transcripts, we will place you in either the appropriate R&C course or an additional Breadth course if your scores fulfill R&C. Choose a Math or Statistics Course

Our Math courses are more challenging than many students expect. Take the online [FPF Math Diagnostic](#) and read [course descriptions](#) carefully to help you choose an appropriate course for your skill level. Indicate your selected course, if any, with an "X". Remember to indicate your selected lecture number and discussion section number, if applicable.

Choose Breadth Courses

Select as many Breadth courses as you need to achieve full-time status, if desired (for Letters & Science, 13 units; for College of Engineering, 12 units). Read [Breadth course descriptions](#), and choose courses that fall under complementary Breadth categories. Each course can fulfill only one Breadth category, even if it falls under multiple categories. American Cultures (AC) courses fulfill the AC requirement as well as one Breadth category. With an "X", indicate selected courses and your selected lecture number and discussion section number, if applicable.

In addition, select four alternate Breadth courses, as space in Breadth courses is limited. If you do not specify alternatives and your first choices are full, FPF staff will place you in Breadth courses that fit your schedule.

Submit Form

Return the Course Selection Form early for the best chance of getting your selected courses. The deadline is June 1, 2009. Do not wait for exam scores or college transcripts; send these to FPF as soon as you receive them.
